AUTHORIZING INCENTIVES FOR LOW FLOW PLUMBING DEVICES

WHEREAS, the Town of Bunn provides potable water to its citizens and customers through a series of water supply wells and connection to the Franklin County Water System; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Bunn realizes the importance of preserving and conserving the precious resource of water; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Bunn desires to help promote the conservation of water through special programs offered to its customers.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF BUNN:


THAT the Town of Bunn does hereby establish incentives to its water customers who install low flow plumbing devices in their homes or businesses, as follows:

1. A one-time rebate of \$5.00, to be deducted from the first water bill after verifiable installation of a new low flow showerhead in a residential dwelling. Additional one-time rebates of \$5.00 will be applied to subsequent water bills for the verifiable installation of additional new low flow showerheads in a residential dwelling – one rebate per month. No rebates will be offered for installation of low flow showerheads on the same shower beyond the first installation. Verification will be by the Town Water & Sewer Superintendent or his designee.
2. A one-time rebate of \$4.00, to be deducted from the first water bill after verifiable installation of a new low flow toilet in a residential dwelling or commercial business. Additional one-time rebates of \$4.00 will be applied to subsequent water bills for the verifiable installation of additional new low flow toilets in a residential dwelling or commercial business – one rebate per month. No rebates will be offered for installation of low flow toilets in the same water closet beyond the first installation. Verification will be by the Town Water & Sewer Superintendent or his designee.

THAT the Town of Bunn will maintain a list of approved low flow plumbing devices at the Town Hall for review by customers contemplating the installation of said devices.

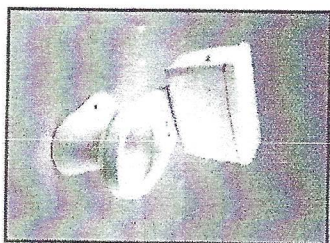

Low-Flow Toilet Incentive

A one-time rebate of \$4.00 will be deducted from the first water bill after verifiable installation of a new low-flow toilet in a residential dwelling. Additional one-time rebates of \$4.00 will be applied to subsequent water bills for the verifiable installation of additional new low-flow toilets in a residential dwelling—one rebate per month. No rebates will be offered for the installation of low-flow toilets on the same shower beyond the first installation. Verification will be by the Town Water and Sewer Superintendent or his/her designee. The person requesting the rebate must make the actual installation available for visual inspection and must provide written information about the toilet, such as packaging, store cut-sheets describing the toilet, or other documentation that indicates that the installed toilet is a low-flow device. The person requesting the rebate must make the actual installation available for visual inspection and must provide written information about the shower head, such as packaging, store cut-sheets describing the shower head, or other documentation that indicates that the installed shower head is a low-flow device.

Low Flow Toilets

Low flow toilets, those that use 1.6 gallons or less per flush (1.6 gpf), have been marketed in the United States since the early 1980's. By 1992, seventeen States had established a standard of 1.6 gpf for replacement toilets and those installed in new construction. The Energy Policy Act of 1992 (EPAct) established a national manufacturing standard of 1.6 gpf for most toilets, the initial stage of which took effect on January 1, 1994.

Use of low flow toilets and other plumbing products due to EPAct will significantly reduce water demand and wastewater generation over time, which, in turn, can reduce or defer the capital investment needed for water supply and wastewater treatment infrastructure.

Low flow toilets are a key component of water efficiency programs conducted in cities across the country. These programs achieve a variety of environmental results in addition to reducing costs. Use of water efficient plumbing fixtures and appliances helps to maintain aquatic habitats; restore wetlands and fisheries; protect groundwater from depletion and contamination; and reduce the amount of energy used to pump, heat and treat drinking water and to pump and treat wastewater.

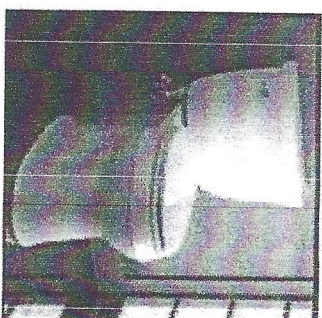
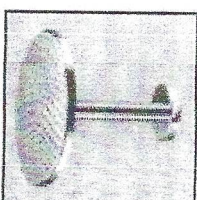


